The Impact of a Child's Experiences While in Foster Care The removal from home can be devastating and confusing for children Once in foster care, children may experience prolonged stays in care According to 2014 AFCARS data, of the 238,230 children who exited foster care in Fiscal Year 2014, 53 percent had been in care 12 months or more⁶
