### **Linux Commands - Red Hat Specific**

The first line would be the default last line of the 'du' output indicating the total size of the directory and another line displaying the same size, followed by the string 'total' This is helpful in case you this command along with the grep command to only display the final total size of a directory as shown below \$ du -ch | grep total
