Why Are People Homeless?

Excessive waiting lists for public housing mean that people must remain in shelters or inadequate housing arrangements longer In a survey of 24 cities, people remain homeless an average of seven months, and 87% of cities reported that the length of time people are homeless has increased in recent years (US Conference of Mayors, 2005)

Homelessness in America: Overview of Data and Causes

People in families made up 374% of the total sheltered and unsheltered homeless population in 201224 The proportion of homeless people who used emergency shelters and transitional housing as part of a family increased from 30% to 35% from 2007 to 2010, with the majority of homeless families
